As a facilities maintenance worker, you will be a jack-of-all-trades who works to maintain the properties of the organization you work for. In this role, you may find yourself working in one of a variety of settings, including retail stores, schools, government buildings, business offices, hospitals, malls, and more. Your responsibility in this role is to service all maintenance issues that may arise.

DAY IN THE LIFE



Facilities maintenance workers typically spend all day on their feet, so it's important for an individual in this role to be in good physical condition. You will likely be required to lift and move heavy materials, such as furniture, machinery, tools, and more. Given the tasks associated with this line of work, strict safety guidelines must be followed.



In this role, you will typically work during hours outside of the traditional 9-5 schedule, including mornings and evenings. Most individuals in this job work a little more than 40 hours per week. If you work somewhere that requires 24-hour maintenance, your hours may vary.
